When Lyndon Johnson hosted world leaders at his Hill Country ranch, he didn't serve them formal state dinners in gilded rooms — he fired up the pit. His first state dinner as president was a barbecue for 300 guests, catered by the legendary "Barbecue King" Walter Jetton, complete with spare ribs, pinto beans, coleslaw, and plenty of cold beer. German chancellors, Mexican presidents, Senate leaders, and old friends alike sat together under the Texas sky along the Pedernales River — united by smoke, good food, and the easy hospitality that only the Hill Country can offer.

This event brings that tradition back to life. Join us as we honor LBJ's legacy of gathering people together — with all the history, heart, and brisket that the occasion deserves.

Texas White House Sponsor | \$10,000

LBJ hosted nearly 100 barbecues for VIPs and friends during his presidency, and the guests at the head of those tables were always the ones who helped make things happen. As our Texas White House Sponsor, that's you.

Barbecue King Sponsor | \$5,000

(Named for Walter Jetton)

Walter Jetton was a natural showman — always dressed in a Stetson, apron, creased white shirt, and string tie. He billed himself as the "Barbecue King" and often had a whole cow rotating on a spit beside a smoldering log fire.

This level is for sponsors who bring that same bold energy and larger-than-life presence to everything they do.

Pedernales Sponsor | \$2,500

Named for the river that ran through the heart of LBJ's world.

Johnson bought his parcel on the banks of the lazy Pedernales River just west of his boyhood home in Johnson City — and the modest ranch became an integral part of the image he wanted to project.

The Pedernales Sponsor reflects that same rooted, community-minded spirit.
